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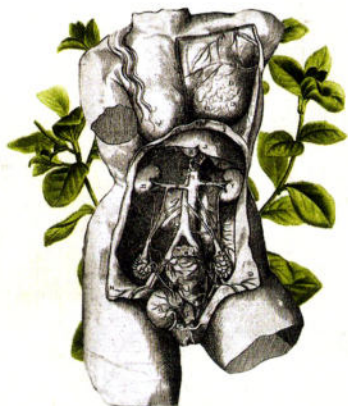
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## Introduction



In writing this book I am overjoyed to share with you all of the tarot knowledge I have learned over the years, not only in relation to each card's imagery and meanings, but also with regards to ways to use the deck to enhance personal growth.

My journey with the tarot began around the age of three, when I became obsessed with a beautiful vintage Swiss 1JJ tarot deck that my mother had bought in England in 1974. I carried those cards with me everywhere.

In my late teens and early twenties I rediscovered my love for tarot. I started reading the cards and collecting decks, but didn't see any that really spoke to me. I assumed there were other readers who felt the same, so, using my training as a digital artist and photo restorer and archivist, I set out on the path of designing my own.

I have always been fascinated by the Victorian era, and the medical and spiritual curiosity of the Victorian people. During this time a person could go from the local apothecary for an herbal remedy straight to a table-tipping party to try to contact spirits. I was drawn to the imagery that was prevalent at the time and would have been seen by the general population. I found anatomical images from medical texts to create the base of each card, then combined those with plant images from botanical journals using digital collage techniques. This deck is my homage to the original artists, healers, and mystics of the era, and I hope that you gain as much joy from using it as I have from designing it.

# History of Tarot

Many ancient theories abound as to the origin of tarot cards, which have undergone various changes over the years.

One theory suggests the card came from India; another presumes the Arabs brought their playing cards with them to Europe. Some scholars believed the Romans brought the tarot with them when they first entered Europe in 1417.

The oldest record of these cards comes from Italy around 1440–1450, when illustrated trump cards were added to a regular deck of cards.

Sometime in the 1700s, playing cards began to be used for divination in occult circles across Europe. In the late 1700s, the first deck for the sole purpose of

fortune-telling was commissioned by the French occultist Etteilla—pseudonym of Jean-Baptiste Alliette—who made a living by giving readings and was the

first person to connect the tarot to the elements, astrology, and other spiritual ideas of the time.

In 1910, Arthur Edward Waite, a poet and scholar, commissioned the artist Pamela Colman Smith to illustrate a deck to accompany his writing on the tarot. Waite's cards were created specifically for divination, so the illustrations were intentionally laden with meaning. Now known as the Rider-Waite deck, the cards were published by the Rider Company in England in 1909, followed in 1911 by Waite's first full book on the subject of tarot reading, *The Pictorial Key to the Tarot*. Waite and Colman Smith had successfully created a deck that took tarot into the mainstream, and paved the way for the modern tarot. In uncertain times we look for life direction, and tarot readings can offer a gateway to connecting with our inner wisdom.

## THE BASICS

## The Major and Minor Arcana

Life is the balance between situations and solutions. The situations are what we consult the tarot about, and the solutions are what are offered by the meaning of each card.

The tarot consists of seventy-eight cards split into sections called the Major Arcana and the Minor Arcana. Arcana is a plural term, meaning secrets or mysteries, which is what we use the tarot to uncover.

### ABOUT THE MAJOR ARCANA

The Major Arcana contains twenty-two named cards, some of which you may already know, such as the Wheel of Fortune or the Star. Beginning with the innocence of the Fool and ending with the wisdom of the World, the Major Arcana reflects the natural cycle of birth and death and everything in between.

The cards of the Major Arcana are the heart and soul of the deck and must

always take precedence in a reading. When these cards turn up, you are receiving what is needed for massive growth and change in your life.

The Major Arcana cards represent the universal aspects of the human experience, such as spirituality, wisdom, innocence, intellect, emotion, and intuition. These themes also exist in the Minor Arcana, but in a smaller and more contained way.



### ABOUT THE MINOR ARCANA

The Minor Arcana consists of fifty-six cards split into four suits: Elixirs (Cups), Rods (Wands), Coins (Pentacles), and Blades (Swords). Each suit contains cards numbered from ace to ten, as well as four named cards—Page, Knight, Queen, and King—called courts. The cards of the Minor Arcana represent decisions, actions, and feelings in the short term (in the coming days or weeks).

The numbered cards represent situations and solutions, while the court cards work a little differently. In a reading, the court cards can occasionally represent a situation in the same way the numbered cards do, but more often they represent a person in your life (including yourself) based on personality traits. Before doing a reading, decide whether you will read these cards as people or situations.

If Minor Arcana cards appear in a reading alongside Major Arcana cards, they act as a support to the theme or lesson of the Major Arcana. Otherwise they are read as normal.

### PIP DECK

The Antique Anatomy Tarot is a “pip” deck, which means that only the Major Arcana and court cards are illustrated figuratively. The numbered Minor Arcana cards are depicted minimally, with just the object relating to the suit featured as many times as the number of the card.

In some decks, the Minor Arcana numbered cards are depicted as scenes that show the meaning of the card. While both deck styles have their advantages, working with pip cards ensures you truly learn the card meanings using memorization.

### CORRESPONDENCES

In addition to their own meanings, cards in the Major and Minor Arcana feature correspondences that relate to numerology, astrology, the elements, and color, as explained on pages 8–13. These associations add extra layers to the meanings and energy of the cards and can be used to enhance your tarot readings.

# Numerology and the Tarot

Numbers play an important role in the tarot. Your understanding of what each number represents can be combined with what you know about the astrological, elemental, and color correspondences of the cards to better understand the messages they reveal.

The twenty-two cards of the Major Arcana are numbered 0 to 21. In order to interpret their numerological representation, double-digit cards are broken down into their base—or master—number. Simply add the two digits together and refer to the numerological representations associated with the sum of the two numbers. For example, the Moon card is number 18. Add together 1 and 8 to get its base number of 9.

The Wheel of Fortune and the Sun have base numbers as both 10 and 1, so you can look to both numerological representations for guidance.

The Fool, which is numbered 0, is a wild card in numerology. It represents all and nothing, the finite and infinite.

The numerology of the Minor Arcana relates to the numbered cards only—don't worry about the court cards. There are no master numbers in the Minor Arcana, so when you have a 10, look only to that representation for extra guidance—do not break it down to 1.

**COMPANION CARDS**

Based on the master number formula, each card in the Major Arcana has one or two companion cards that share its base energy. For example, the Moon card's companion card is the Hermit.

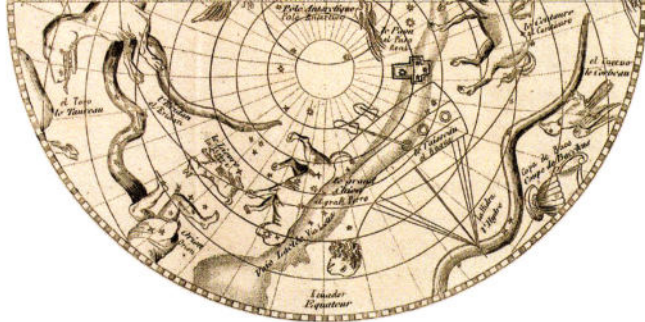
Knowing the meaning of one card in a companion set can help you learn the other cards' meanings. The Hermit deals with introspection and uncovering the

truth; therefore the Moon, its companion, must also relate to these themes in some way. This could be by enforcing the meaning, or opposing it altogether.

Pay special attention when companion cards appear together in one reading. This signals that the issues or questions are making a bigger impact than you may have originally thought.

## Astrology and the Tarot

A basic understanding of astrology—how the positions and movements of stars and planets influence our lives—can be used to add an extra layer to your readings.

### ASTROLOGY AND THE MAJOR ARCANA

In the Major Arcana, each card is associated with either an astrological sign, a planet, the sun, or the moon. Astrology is a powerful tool on its own, and when combined with the tarot it can help add dimension to your readings and interpretation of the cards. For example:

- ‡ If you are a Leo and consistently pull the Strength card, you know your zodiac sign traits are very prominent and need to be given extra attention. This can mean that, in answer to your question, you need be braver and bolder, like your zodiac sign.
- ‡ You are doing a reading about a presentation at work, and you pull the Magician. You know this card is associated with Mercury, which rules communication. You can take this to mean that you need to pay extra attention to how you convey your ideas.

### ASTROLOGY AND THE MINOR ARCANA

In the Minor Arcana, astrological correspondences can represent you or other people, and the personality traits of the court cards, but can also signify times of year and seasons. For example:

- ‡ You do a reading about the possibility of taking a vacation, in which quite a few Rods appear. This can mean that spring is the ideal time to take a trip.
- ‡ While doing a reading about your relationship, the Knight of Blades appears. The personality traits of this card seem a lot like your Gemini partner. This can be interpreted as confirmation of your feelings.

# The Elements and the Tarot

The four elements of Earth, Air, Fire, and Water form the base energies for the four suits of the Minor Arcana; they also rule certain cards in the Major Arcana.

## EARTH

The element of Earth represents the physical world and all that is tangible. It is a very grounding and stable energy, and is associated with the five senses. This element is healing, but also allows you to grow and change.

## AIR

The Air element rules over intellect and the balancing and opposing nature of thoughts. It is a fast-moving energy that seems to be invisible, but is always there. This element forces you to look at different perspectives and deal with the challenges in your life.

The Fire element rules creation and inner spirit. This element responds to how it is handled. When in control, you can use fire as a positive tool; lose that control and it can be destructive and painful.

The element of Water represents emotions and relationships. It can be calm and gentle or forceful and dangerous. Like water, emotions ebb and flow and are influenced by their surroundings.

## Color and the Tarot

Color evokes all sorts of emotional responses in us. These feelings can range from serenity to joy to despair. The colors connected to the deck add depth to and heighten the meanings of the cards.

Though all colors have multiple meanings, being aware of your response to a particular color can help you recall the meaning of the card. For example, the black flowers on the Devil represent the fear and domination aspect of that card, while the Aces contain an array of colors that represent the rainbow bridge between the spiritual planes of existence. Green appears frequently throughout the deck and represents ourselves and our living energy, which connect the cards.

### COLOR AND THE MINOR ARCANA

Each of the suits of the Minor Arcana has its own color family association. The black and white of the Blades reflect the harshness of the suit, and our ability to process both negative and positive thoughts. The Elixirs feature blues, pinks, and purples, which represent the dreamy, emotional qualities of this suit. The oranges, yellows, and reds of the Rods are lively and energetic, and express the creative aspect of this suit. The yellows, purples, and blues of the Coins point to the material nature of this suit, which focuses on wealth and luxury.

### COLOR ASSOCIATIONS

# Ways of Using the Tarot



The main purpose of tarot is to do readings using spreads. But as you will soon discover, there are many other ways to use the power of the cards to understand your life.

## TAROT SPREADS

A tarot reading is a conversation with the deck. You ask the cards a question, and they provide an answer. See pages 18–23 for more information about spreads and how to use the cards in this way.

## MEDITATION

Every card has a specific meaning and energy associated with it. The Major Arcana are the most powerful cards in the deck, and they make the perfect companion for meditative practice.

- ‡ Separate the Major Arcana from the rest of the deck.
- ‡ Look through the cards until you find one you feel especially drawn to.
- ‡ Now focus for a few minutes on the meaning of the card and how it makes you feel. Acknowledge your initial reaction to the card. Perhaps it makes you feel calm, agitated, or happy. Meditate on these feelings.
- ‡ Think about how you can incorporate the lesson of the card into your life. Is the meaning of the card an energy to accept, or one to release?

## DREAM INTERPRETATION

Dreams are tools of the subconscious mind. They help you to unravel the events of the day, to better understand your hopes and aspirations, and to de-stress. Unfortunately, the mind is an intricate entity, and sometimes you can wake up feeling more confused than when you went to sleep. In these instances, you can use the tarot to help reveal a dream's meaning.

- ‡ While shuffling the deck, focus on this question: What is the underlying meaning of this dream?
- ‡ When you feel ready, stop shuffling. Turn over the top card.
- ‡ Use the meanings associated with this card to help you interpret the dream.

## SPELL WORK

If you have an interest in tarot you may also believe in magic, or, at the very least, the power of manifestation. Tarot cards can be incorporated into your spell work or ritual practice.

- ‡ Choose a card from the deck that will enhance your spell. For example, if

you are casting a spell about finding a new job, you might choose the Eight of Coins to encourage fast change; to cultivate partnership and romance, you might choose the Ace or Two of Elixirs.

- ‡ Add the card to the altar or area where you perform your rituals.
- ‡ Carrying a card with you is also an easy way to stay connected to that energy.

### JOURNALING

Journaling with the cards can be very helpful when you are learning tarot for the first time, deepening your understanding of the cards, or reconnecting to your current practice. Tarot can also deepen your existing relationship with journaling, especially if you have been doing it for a while and your process has grown stale or predictable.

If you are new to tarot reading, or want to reconnect to your practice, pulling a card each day and writing down its meaning and correspondences can help you memorize the cards. This exercise can be especially helpful with a deck that features pip cards (see page 7), since there is a lot of memorization required.

The act of writing can also help you see the cards from a new perspective. Make a note of the colors on the cards and how they make you feel. Think about whether the astrological correspondences have significance for you.

- ‡ Dedicate a small amount of time each day or week to write about your experience with the cards in a journal.
- ‡ You can start with one card a day, or try one of the spreads.
- ‡ Choose a card at random by shuffling, or journal about the deck in order.
- ‡ Make notes about colors, astrological associations, the elements, and numerology.

If you are unsure of where to start, or need some new prompts, try one of these:

*I pulled the [card]. What happened today that relates to this card?*

*What court card personality am I?*

*My favorite card is the [card] because . . .*

*My least favorite card is the [card] because . . .*

*Tarot makes me feel . . .*

*A card that appears for me a lot in my readings is . . .*

*No matter how hard I try, I can't seem to understand the [card]. Why do I think this is?*

*Today I did my first reading. It was . . .*



*You can pick cards at random, choose cards you are drawn to, or seek out cards that specifically help you in your aim.*

*An amethyst crystal placed on top of your deck helps to release stagnant or negative energy.*



## Caring for Your Deck



Tarot decks are spiritual tools and deserve—sometimes even demand—respect and care. The way you treat your deck is a reflection of how you treat yourself, and that energy is going to come through in your readings. There are various ways to care for your deck. However, your relationship with the tarot is personal, and there is no right or wrong when it comes to these practices.

## INITIATING YOUR DECK

You will be relying on the tarot cards to provide you with accurate information and answers, so when you open a new deck take some time to bond with it before you use it. Start by cleansing the deck using one of the methods described below. Next, flick through all seventy-eight cards and familiarize yourself with the images and suits. Reflect on which cards you are instantly attracted to and which you are not.

## CLEANSING

Tarot decks work in union with your personal energy, and have a tendency to hold on to it. Cleansing or recharging the deck allows you to clear out stagnant energy, and there are various ways you can do this.

- ‡ **Incense:** This is the most popular method of cleansing. Light the end of a stick of incense or sage and pass the deck through the smoke.
- ‡ **Crystals:** Lay a crystal—such as quartz or amethyst—on top of the deck for a few minutes (or a few days, it's your call) to release stagnant energy.
- ‡ **Visualization:** If you don't have incense or crystals on hand, visualization is a quick and easy way to recharge. Picture a gentle breeze blowing negativity or stagnant energy away from the deck.
- ‡ **Salt ring:** Salt is a powerful cleanser that absorbs everything near it. Place the deck inside a ring of salt (any type will do) for a few minutes.

## PREPARING AN ALTAR

You do not have to make a special space for tarot work, but using an altar can help you to achieve a set frame of mind and incorporate a routine into your practice. First, choose a space where you feel relaxed and comfortable, and where you won't be disturbed. While readings can be done on any surface, using a table is the easiest and most practical option, especially with larger spreads. Decorate the area with objects of importance to you: This should be a personal and fun process. Your options are unlimited, but some ideas include photographs, candles, crystals, incense, plants, decorative tablecloths, or animal bones.

## STORAGE

Where you keep your cards is, of course, a matter of personal choice. If you have a dedicated space in the home for readings, then it makes sense to keep the cards there. Storing decks on shelves or in boxes protects them from dust and spills, but bear in mind that you may forget about them if they are hidden away.

If you leave your decks out, on display, you are always ready for a reading, and will probably be more active in your practice. However, kept in the open they are more vulnerable to damage.

# The Spreads



Reading the tarot, in the traditional sense, is done through spreads—predetermined positions into which the cards are placed. Think of each position in the spread as a question or a specific part of an overall question or inquiry. The card revealed in that position represents the answer to that question.

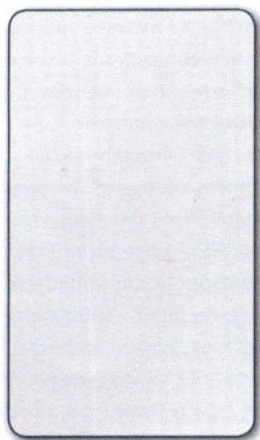
The spreads detailed over the next few pages can be used in any situation, and it is entirely up to you which one to choose at any time.

Start by shuffling the cards. There is no one right way to shuffle, so do what feels good in the moment.

You are now ready to start pulling cards. Pulling from the top is the simplest option, but you can pull from anywhere in the deck. Place each card facedown, in particular spread positions if relevant. When all the cards are in place, turn them over and begin to read them one by one. If the spread calls for it, then read the cards together. Do they relate to one another? Are they opposing? Are there repeating numbers? Don't worry, this will get easier with practice.

## ONE CARD SPREAD

This is the most basic spread and a great place to start. Ask a question and pull one card. With this simple and effective technique the possibilities are endless.



*Where should I focus my energy today?  
How does . . . feel about me?  
What can I do about . . . ?*

### THREE CARD SPREAD

The three card spread is a popular choice with both beginner and advanced readers due to its simplicity and flexibility. It is easy to read, but contains multiple cards, which add layers to the story. Think about your question and pull three cards. Lay them side by side from left to right and read them in that order.

If you choose, you can assign an aspect of the question to each of the three positions.

After the initial reading, look at the relationships between the cards out of order. Some questions you might consider include:

*Are there complementary cards?*

*Are there opposing cards?*

*Are numbers or colors repeated?*

*What elements are present?*

*Are there multiple Major Arcana cards?*

*Are there no Minor Arcana cards?*

**MOON CYCLE SPREAD**

This spread is actually a series of single card readings designed to be read over the course of one moon cycle, which lasts 28½ days. It is especially effective for guidance with big goals and plans that you can take your time over.

Beginning with the new moon, and ending on the waning crescent moon, pull one card for each phase.

**NEW MOON • BEGINNING**

Think about a goal you have and draw the first card. Does this card work in harmony with that, or does it seem at odds? Will this path be smooth or difficult?

**WAXING CRESCENT MOON • INITIATIVE**

Now that you have a clear idea of what you want to achieve and what the journey will be like, what should your initial steps be to get things moving?

**FIRST QUARTER MOON • GROWTH**

How do you keep the momentum going when you feel like quitting?

**WAXING GIBBOUS MOON • PERFECTING**

What details might you be overlooking that are imperative to your goal?

**FULL MOON • CLARITY**

What will this process teach you about yourself?

**WANING GIBBOUS MOON • SHARING**

How does your goal help others? Do you have support from your community? Are there rewards for achieving your goal that can be shared?

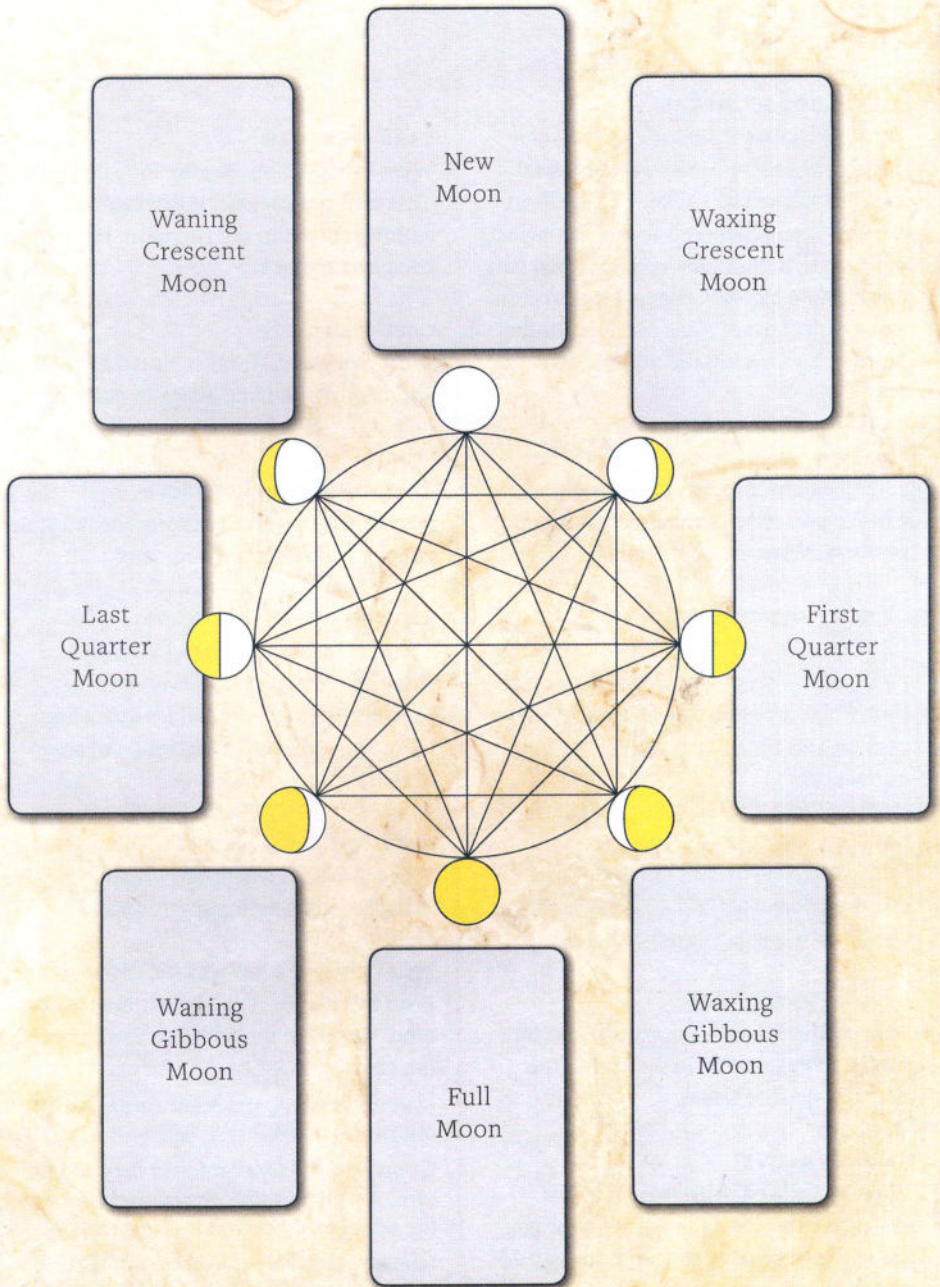
**LAST QUARTER MOON • DECLINE**

What will the final touches require? What energy will you need for the final push in achieving your goal?

**WANING CRESCENT MOON • ENDING**

What is the outcome? Did you achieve your goal? Are there still things that need to be worked on?





**CELTIC CROSS SPREAD**

The Celtic cross is a classic spread, and arguably the most used by professional and amateur readers alike. It is involved enough that it covers all important aspects of a question, but not so complicated that it leaves the inquirer more confused than when they started. Place each card in its position and read in the order shown.

**CARD 1 • THE PRESENT**

This card represents you in relation to your question. In relation to the situation, what is your state of mind? What is your position? What are your feelings?

**CARD 2 • THE CHALLENGE**

What crosses you? What is the immediate problem you need to overcome? Remember that even if you pull a traditionally “good” card for this position, it will still represent a challenge.

**CARD 3 • THE PAST**

What has led up to this situation? This could tell you what brought on the question or present situation.

**CARD 4 • THE FUTURE**

This position represents the short-term future: things that will arise within the next few days or weeks.

**CARD 5 • ABOVE**

What is your goal with regards to the situation? This card represents what you are trying to achieve and what you would like to happen.

**CARD 6 • BELOW**

What is happening in your subconscious? This card represents the driving force within yourself in the situation. Have you been aware of this?

**CARD 7 • ADVICE**

What can you do for this situation? What approach should you adopt in order to help things along?

**CARD 8 • EXTERNAL FORCES**

What energies and situations beyond your control will affect the outcome?

**CARD 9 • HOPES AND FEARS**

Think of the law of attraction in this situation. Are you hopeful that the outcome will be positive? Do you want to be hopeful even though you are afraid of failure?
