

City Labyrinth Tarot

Many tarot decks that refer to life in the old days or to fairy tales have already been created. But decks showing the life of modern people in a metropolis are not so often found.

The City Labyrinth Tarot deck is about life in New York in the early 2000s. The phones, computers, and cars that the characters use are typical of the time and already seem outdated. In addition, some Arcana contain direct references to the millennium. Thus, the heroine of The High Priestess resembles the Oracle from the film 'The Matrix' and the card The Tower depicts a tragic terrorist attack on the Twin Towers.



MAJOR ARCANA

o. The Fool

The upright card indicates important changes in your life which are likely to be unplanned and could require a lot of your vitality.

The reversed card signifies instability, disruptions in your work, carelessness, helplessness and making mistakes.

1. The Magician

The upright card signifies progress, achievement of the set goals, great opportunities, as well as your self-confidence and ability to learn something new.

The reversed card indicates fame, selfishness, loss of contact with your family or acquaintances, mental disease, and unfulfilled dreams.



2. The High Priestess

When upright, the card signifies intuition, the power of emotions and feelings, psychic abilities. It also suggests a large number of secrets that will be hidden from you.

When reversed, the card means weakness, indecision, seething of various emotions, the lack of spirituality and intuition.

3. The Empress

The upright card signifies love, understanding, harmony, mutual assistance. It suggests wedding and birth of children.

When reversed, the card indicates lack of balance and harmony, irritability and moodiness, as well as money problems and troubles at home.



4. The Emperor

The upright card presents a strong, domineering and goal – oriented person, who can give you a reliable support and help you both in love and business.

The reversed card signifies pressure, powerlessness, the presence of enemies, and also failure, and moral violence.

5. The Hierophant

The upright card signifies sexual attraction and marriage, as well as the search for the truth, and the presence of a wise mentor, strong and domineering. You should listen to this person's advice, because he can lead you to success.

The reversed card indicates cruelty, an increased self-interest, breaking up the rules and standards, weakness, inability to defend one's



beliefs.

6. The Lovers

The Lovers embody the first people on earth. The upright card signifies a strong union to be crowned with success, the right choice and harmony with yourself and the others.

The reversed card indicates disappointment, breaking up relations, making plans which are almost impossible to fulfill, and also illness and disease.

7. The Chariot

The upright card signifies journey, victory, striving for light, as well as triumph, confidence, overcoming all obstacles.

When reversed, the card suggests defeat, negative emotions, uncontrollable rage, lack of organization, failure.



8. Strength

When upright, the card signifies platonic love, recovery, restoration of the body's vital reserves, fearlessness, harmony, willingness to take responsibility and action.

When reversed, the card indicates despotism, tyranny, detachment, defeat. The card represents an unbalanced person near you who can negatively affect your life.

9. The Hermit

The upright card indicates cognition, detachment, caution, removal of unnecessary acquaintances from your life, and also the ability to achieve success in solving the most difficult problems, awareness of mystery and truth.

The reversed card signifies loneliness, forced isolation, fear of other people, fraud and trickery, disregard



of the reason.

10. Wheel of Fortune

The upright card signifies movement, striving for success, inconstancy and fickleness, frequent mood swings, also changes for the better and good luck.

The reversed card suggests gambling, losing, money problems, failures, inability to realize yourself.

11. Justice

The upright card indicates making the right decision, victory in a competition, your colleagues' respect. The card also means professional skills and balance.

The reversed card signifies fanaticism, aggression, despotism. It also suggests money problems and abuse of power.



12. The Hanged Man

The Hanged Man represents a martyr who made a conscious sacrifice. The upright card indicates search for personal freedom, changes, your movement to a new level and rejection of material well-being.

The reversed card suggests disease, passivity, your creative power stagnation, a needless sacrifice, and depression.

13. Death

Death card does not imply any physical death. It is more about the completion of one life stage and the beginning of the new. The upright card indicates changes in your life.

The reversed card signifies depression, losses, betrayal of ideals, and collapse of plans.



14. Temperance

The upright card signifies your being economical, ability to compromise, and humility. It indicates diplomacy in relations, the appearance of new employees and colleagues.

The reversed card suggests trials, struggles at the workplace, losses, stinginess, lack of restraint, breaking up relations.

15. The Devil

The upright card suggests various trials awaiting you on the way, but you have enough strength and desire to overcome them. It also signifies obsession with power and money.

The reversed card means ambition, cruelty, some failed plans, an uncontrollable situation.



16. The Tower

The upright card signifies difficulties, devastation in the soul, some failed plans, losses, and oppression.

The reversed card indicates financial losses, breaking up affections, disasters, deception on the part of a loved one.

17. The Star

The upright card suggests that your life can change for the better. You can have new chances and opportunities. The card signifies recovery, renewal of spirit, happiness and serenity.

When reversed, the card means isolation and seclusion, dissatisfaction with oneself, disbelief, powerlessness, and disappointment.

18. The Moon

The upright card means fraud. You



are unaware of something and this fact can spoil your life. The card indicates an enemy, probable illness in the near future.

The reversed card signifies instability, disease, fears and phobias, dangers.

19. The Sun

The upright card signifies health, material well-being, harmony with you and the world. It also suggests conception, birth of children, happiness, and wedding.

The reversed card means recovery, impatience, success, but also excessive self-confidence.

20. Judgement

The upright card signifies change, revival, victory over yourself. It suggests good news, new work, wedding, birth of children.



The reversed card means fear, disease, resistance to natural changes in life, repentance.

21. The World

The upright card signifies success and harmony, as well as journey and a pleasant meeting.

The reversed card means calmness, willingness to help others.

THE SUIT CARDS

SWORDS

Ace of Swords

The upright card indicates victory, your influence on people, having children, wedding, and financial stability.

The reversed card means fraud, breaking up relations, despotism, and tyranny.



Two of Swords

The upright card signifies your strength, willingness to defeat the enemy. You have already passed through a difficult period and there are some improvements ahead of you.

The reversed card indicates fraud and trickery, betrayal, quarrel and sorting things out, promiscuity in relations.

Three of Swords

The upright card signifies a broken heart, love triangle, breaking up relations, confrontation with others, lots of negative emotions, betrayal.

The reversed card suggests insults and feelings hurting, an unchangeable situation. You too often feel sorry for yourself, but nothing can be changed.



Four of Swords

The upright card signifies loneliness, escape from life, an attempt to relax, but also health improvement.

The reversed card indicates hypocrisy, lack of funds, and loss of close friends

Five of Swords

The upright card signifies tension, lack of belief, conflicts. Someone encroaches on what is yours.

The reversed card suggests trickery, fraud, unprofitable deal, and self-doubt.

Six of Swords

When upright, the card means that you managed to overcome difficulties and can expect changes only for the better, as well as journey and success.

When reversed, the card indicates



your being too slow and hesitant. You need to be more decisive. You can also have problems on your way.

Seven of Swords

The upright card suggests a liar near you who pretends to be another person. He encroaches on what is yours, spreads gossip, and can bring you a lot of troubles.

The reversed card tells you to be alert. You can expect to be given good advice and offered patronage. You should not refuse help from a person of influence.

Eight of Swords

The upright card signifies an out-of-control situation, your failed plans, health problems, and conflicts.

The reversed card says that you should not hesitate; it's your time to act, because your indecision can



make things worse.

Nine of Swords

The upright card signifies disappointment, mental disease, suffering, betrayal, and infidelity.

The reversed card means hope and belief; you should pull yourself together.

Ten of Swords

The upright card indicates grief, betrayal by a loved one. You need to give up everything and start living anew.

The reversed card suggests troubles and a very strange person near you who is plotting.

Page of Swords

The upright card represents a young man ready to help you. It also signifies laziness and lack of



strength.

The reversed card suggests enemies and opponents, bad news and changers for the worse.

Knight of Swords

The upright card signifies the appearance of a strong person ready to protect you, as well as your moving forward, victory and triumph.

The reversed card indicates an accident, aggression, disease, emergency of enemies.

Queen of Swords

The upright card represents a strong woman of authority who patronizes you.

The reversed card signifies a scheming, cruel and dangerous lady, as well as breaking up relations.



King of Swords

The upright card represents a strong mature man, domineering and cruel, who is involved in politics or military affairs.

The reversed card signifies submission, struggle, a conflict situation, competition.

CUPS

Ace of Cups

The upright card signifies generosity, wedding for love, children, abundance, and creative energy.

The reversed card means selfishness, unhappiness in love, breaking up relations.

Two of Cups

The upright card signifies love, carnal pleasures, and unity with a partner, passion.



The reversed card indicates disagreements, cooling of feelings, unrequited love, and promiscuous sex.

Three of Cups

The upright card signifies success, material well-being, positive emotions, and recovery.

The reversed card indicates betrayal, failure, lack of harmony.

Four of Cups

The upright card signifies longing, depression, melancholy, unwillingness to do something in your life.

The reversed card indicates changes for the better, love, and new acquaintances.

Five of Cups

The upright card signifies losses, depression, breaking up relations, mental wounds.



The reversed card suggests making new friends, thinking the situation over, calmness and serenity.

Six of Cups

The upright card signifies financial well-being, old lover's return, family happiness.

The reversed card indicates bustle, obtaining new skills, a joyful event approaching.

Seven of Cups

The upright card signifies flight of fantasy, too strong emotions, confusion and inability to adequately assess the situation.

The reversed card indicates making the right decision, overcoming difficulties, moving towards success.



Eight of Cups

The upright card suggests parting, upheaval of the value system, and tiredness. You can get a chance to start all over again.

The reversed card indicates new acquaintances, strong feelings, and happiness.

Nine of Cups

The upright card signifies success, financial stability, health, and control over the situation.

The reversed card indicates abuse of power and wealth.

Ten of Cups

The upright card signifies happiness, marriage to your beloved one, striving for success.

The reversed card indicates instability, quarrels with your loved ones, and problems at work.



Page of Cups

When upright, the card indicates strong emotional links and relations, some new interesting acquaintances, your creative energy, and a probable journey.

When reversed, the card suggests all your recourses being unused, betrayal and infidelity, intrigues and gossip.

Knight of Cups

The upright card signifies happiness, love and success.

The reversed card indicates mistakes, sad news, love triangle and trickery.

Queen of Cups

The upright card signifies love, ability to realize yourself, a happy family life and wisdom.

The reversed card means gossip,



immorality, the desire to escape from reality.

King of Cups

The upright card signifies a strong marriage and patronage of a mature man.

The reversed card indicates fraud and trickery, as well as cruelty and excessive ambition.

PENTACLES

Ace of Pentacles

The upright card signifies success, harmony, and new fair chances.

The reversed card indicates anxiety, devastation and obsession with money.

Two of Pentacles

The upright card indicates good luck, pleasures, changes for the bet-



ter and good news.

The reversed card suggests anxiety, money problems, misunderstanding, and loss of control over the situation.

Three of Pentacles

The upright card signifies material benefits, the emergence of new partners, high professional skills.

The reversed card indicates criticism, inexperience, and stagnation.

Four of Pentacles

The upright card indicates confidence, material stability, and obtaining inheritance.

The reversed card signifies obsession with power and money, indecision, failure.

Five of Pentacles

The upright card signifies disease,



failure, collapse.

The reversed card suggests withstanding failures, the emergence of confederates and like-minded people.

Six of Pentacles

The upright card signifies generosity, success at work, prosperity.

The reversed card suggests fraud and trickery, loss of a large amount of money.

Seven of Pentacles

The upright card signifies financial growth, movement towards the set goal.

The reversed card means loss and bankruptcy.

Eight of Pentacles

The upright card signifies success, realization of your potential creativity,



enjoying life.

The reversed card means routine, lack of plans, longing and melancholy.

Nine of Pentacles

The upright card indicates recreation and relaxation, material well-being, stability.

The reversed card signifies loss of money, betrayal and infidelity, loneliness.

Ten of Pentacles

The upright card indicates making profits, obtaining inheritance, getting closer to your relatives.

The reversed card indicates collapse and failure, bankruptcy, a difficult situation.

Page of Pentacles

The upright card signifies obtaining



some new knowledge, new acquaintances, and changes for the better.

The reversed card indicates disorganization and careless spending.

Knight of Pentacles

The upright card signifies profits, journey, high professional skills, and good news.

The reversed card indicates instability, disorganization, losses.

Queen of Pentacles

The upright card signifies patronage and generosity.

The reversed card indicates fraud and trickery, greed, stinginess.

King of Pentacles

The upright card represents a practical person; it also signifies success, will and dedication.

The reversed card suggests dan-



gerous money manipulation.

WANDS

Ace of Wands

The upright card signifies luck, money, activity, career growth.

The reversed card indicates apathy, melancholy, troubles and failures at work.

Two of Wands

The upright card signifies belief in success, obtaining new knowledge, stability.

The reversed card means uncertainty, doubt, and melancholy.

Three of Wands

The upright card signifies stability, success and reliable cooperation.

The reversed card means illness,



losses, self-doubt.

Four of Wands

The upright card indicates financial well-being, fulfillment of wishes and desires, success.

The reversed card signifies good news, and material well-being; but you need to make every effort to achieve what you planned.

Five of Wands

The upright card indicates some new competitors, quarrels and arguments, defending interests, the emergence of a new source of income.

The reversed card suggests conflicts and trickery.

Six of Wands

The upright card signifies triumph, ambitiousness, leadership.

The reversed card indicates self-



doubt, money problems, bad news.

Seven of Wands

The upright card suggests competitors and conflicts, but you need to be determined and decisive.

The reversed card indicates stinginess, depression, confusion.

Eight of Wands

The upright card signifies journey, fulfillment of desires and wishes, haste and hurry.

The reversed card suggests an unpleasant journey, lack of time and deadlines.

Nine of Wands

The upright card signifies health, delay, and struggle.

The reversed card means stubbornness and obstinacy, danger and obstacles on the way.



Ten of Wands

The upright card indicates fame and good luck, but you have to take on other people's problems.

The reversed card signifies cruelty; you can find it difficult to achieve success.

Page of Wands

The upright card signifies hospitality, good news, fulfillment of your plans, ambition.

The reversed card indicates rivalry, fraud, and trick.

Knight of Wands

The upright card signifies journey, friendliness, but also selfishness.

The reversed card suggests problems at work, jealousy, and competition.



Queen of Wands

The upright card signifies high professional skills, independence, experience, and money.

The reversed card indicates selfishness, fraud, and jealousy.

King of Wands

The upright card signifies success, a happy union, wealth and power.

The reversed card indicates despotism, conflict, cruelty.
