INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the world of the Earth Woman. This Tarot brings together the incredible power of women, combining the mystic realm of the Divine Feminine with the earthly wisdom of Mother Nature. Celestial imagery will help you feel in touch with the universe, reminding you that you are part of something bigger, and connecting you to the divine guidance. Imagery of the natural world will show you that answers can be found all around you, in nature. Overall, the magic emanating from this deck is a wonderful celebration of the beautiful world we live in—the planet we call home.

The Earth Woman deck was born out of my deep love of Mother Nature. Growing up in the countryside, and since then having wandered far and wide, I have developed a deep affinity with the natural world. I have al-



ways chosen the path less traveled, far from the chaos of the crowds. I have always found peace in nature. In this peace, I feel a deep flow of energy coursing through me, offering guidance and wisdom. In the lap of Mother Nature, I feel held and understood; I have all the space I need to express myself and look deeply within. Many answers reveal themselves to me as I try to emanate the simplicity of the way of nature in my own life. This Tarot is rooted in these musings, encapsulating the ancient wisdom of Mother Nature and the Divine Feminine.

The artwork is female-focused, depicting women of different ethnicities and backgrounds so that everyone may see themselves in this deck. All aspects of the feminine are depicted, from softness and gentility to strength and power. By capturing the contrasting elements of what it means to be a woman, you are invited to be yourself unapologetically. Earth Woman Tarot gives you the space to embrace every part of yourself, reminding you that you are a multifaceted being. You are welcomed to connect with your darkness as well as your light to understand yourself to the truest extent.

In using this deck, your female intuition will be nurtured and cultivated. You will be reminded of your deep rooted, intrinsic con-



nection to nature and the Earth around you. Earth Woman Tarot helps you become more in tune with your feminine energy and the forces that run through you. This deck serves as a reminder of your power as a woman, and the magic that you can make.

You will notice that the figures depicted on the cards have no faces: this is to allow you to interpret each card without restriction. Thanks to these expressionless faces, you are free to read each card in your own way, projecting yourself in the artwork without the distraction of predetermined emotions, so that the energy and guidance from the card can be channeled and understood.

Earth Woman Tarot is inspired by the classical symbology of the Waite-Smith tradition, with plenty of recognizable features for the Arcana. This user-friendly guidebook gives you more details about the meaning behind each card.

So, get ready to let the Earth Woman empower you, enrich you, and offer you invaluable guidance on your journey.



HOW TO USE THE DECK

Whenever guidance is required, pick up your Earth Woman deck and let it speak to you.

On opening your deck for the first time, you should shuffle the cards to infuse your energy in them. This will help the deck to get to know you in order to give you the best possible advice. You can use the cards in whatever way makes sense to you: there is no right or wrong way. You may want to use them in different ways depending on how you are feeling at that time. You may draw any number of cards, continuing to pull new cards until you feel satisfied. The interpretation of the cards is also completely up to you. The meaning you extract from the card will be personal, and again will depend on how you are feeling in that precise moment. Feel free to interpret the cards in your own way, making personal interpretations of the artwork. They will transmit exactly what is needed to help you. If you are unsure of the meaning and would like some more precise guidance, feel free to look at the guidebook. This will offer an explanation of the card and a possible way in which that interpretation may apply to you.

Below are some suggested spreads to help you obtain wisdom and advice from your Earth Woman Tarot deck.



SINGLE-CARD SPREAD



The single-card spread can be useful in gaining an answer to a question. To use the deck in this way, formulate a specific question. While thinking about your question or problem, shuffle the cards until you feel called to stop. Spread the cards face down in front of you. Hover your hand over the cards and choose the card that you feel a pull toward. Turn the card over and study the artwork: What can you see? How does it make you feel? The answer you are seeking may be instantly clear, or you may have to look more deeply into the card and its possible meanings to gain some insight. If you need further guidance, refer to the guidebook.



CHANNELING THE EARTH WOMAN



This three-card spread can be used to gain insight when you don't have a specific question in mind. Shuffle the cards, spread them out in front of you, and choose three of them. Lay them out side by side.

1. Abundance – This card shows you where you are flourishing in life. It represents what you are doing well and succeeding at. Take a moment to celebrate that.

2. The Shadow – The second card shows you what you have been avoiding or hiding. This suggests what you need to face, advising you to acknowledge and work on it.

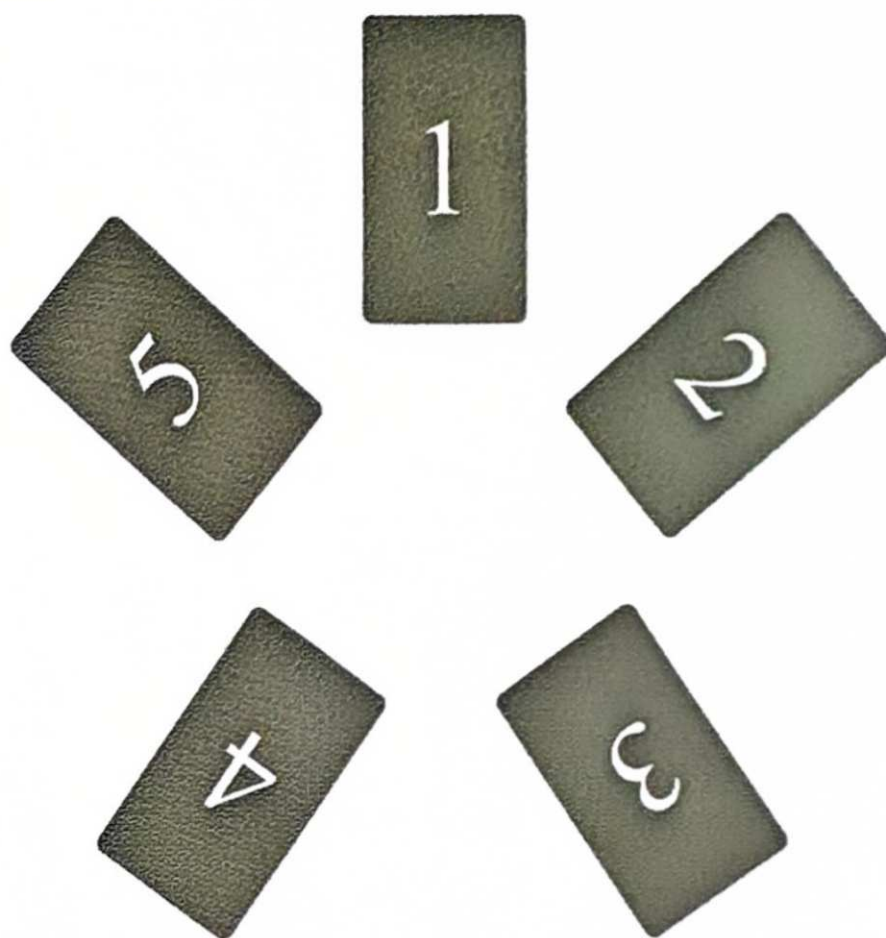
3. The Butterfly – This card represents the area of your life that is about to undergo deep transformation. It represents what is about to change, and asks you to surrender and embrace this shift.



Again, you may interpret the cards yourself, using the artwork as guidance. Spend some time looking at the card, allow the meanings to reveal themselves to you. If you need more assistance in your interpretation, refer to the guidebook.



EARTH WOMAN FLOWER



This five-card spread is useful if you have a general concern or are seeking guidance about a broader situation. It will allow you to see things in a new way and gain clarity over them. In this way, you can step in to your full potential. Shuffle the cards, lay them out in front of you and choose five of them. Lay them out in the shape of a flower, as pictured.



1. **The Secret** – This first card unveils your subconscious and represents what you are missing. This is the piece of the puzzle that you have not seen yet, and it is important to understand things more deeply.

2. **The Overinvested** – This second card represents what you are spending too much energy and resources on. It invites you to let go so that you may make space for other things.

3. **The Misinterpreted** – This card symbolizes something that you have misjudged. It offers you a new way of viewing that situation or person.

4. **The Small** – This card represents what is keeping you from blossoming into the next incredible version of yourself. It shows you how you have been stopping yourself from growing.

5. **The Key** – This card represents what you need to do in order to take this next step to become who you are meant to be. This is what you need to focus on to move forward and bloom!



MAJOR ARCANA

0. THE FOOL

New Beginnings, Inexperience, Leap of Faith

The Fool stands at the edge of a cliff, ready to take a leap away from the safety she knows to the unknown world below. She enters with awe and wonder, without expectations. Not yet rational or cautious, the Fool acts on instincts and intuition, trusting the process with the knowledge that the universe will deliver what she deserves. She takes with her only a shoulder bag of flowers. An outright minimalist, she knows her journey will take her where it is meant to. Her gaze is fixed upon the bright sun above, blissfully unaware of the difficulties she may encounter. This card is full of infinite potential and calls on you to take a leap of faith. It tells you to put aside your fears and act spontaneously without overthinking. Embrace your new beginning and trust the universe.

I. THE MAGICIAN

Manifestation, Power, Potential

The magician sits with one hand toward the sky and the other directed toward the ground beneath her. This signifies her ability to har-



ness the power of both the spirit and the material realm to manifest her dreams. The lemniscate which hovers above her head like a halo represents her access to infinite potential. The appearance of the Magician suggests that you are full of creative ideas and aspirations. Right now, you have all the necessary tools to bring your dreams and ideas into fruition. Everything you need is at your fingertips, ready for you to alchemize, and now is the time to take action. Look for guidance from the universe, as well as your own intelligence and intuition. Use your unlimited potential to your advantage and manifest your dreams.

II. THE HIGH PRIESTESS

Intuition, Divine Feminine, Subconscious

The High Priestess resides in a state of divine femininity. The pomegranates which surround her signify abundance and fertility, and her lunar-lit crown represents feminine mysteries. She is flanked by two pillars: the left one stands for Boaz (strength) and the right for Jachin (support). The colors of the pillars signify the attributes of duality: start and finish, dark and light, war and peace. The moons symbolize her connection to her subconscious and the natural cycles of nature. The High Priestess calls you to tune in to your Di-



vine Feminine and all things associated with Her. Be led by your heightened intuition and lean in to your ability to access the subconscious. Now is the time to listen to your inner self. The High Priestess is a reminder of the deep wisdom resting inside your soul.

III. THE EMPRESS

Abundance, Creativity, Fertility

The beautiful Empress sits comfortably upon her throne. She is surrounded by a peaceful scene of nature, showing her connection with Mother Earth. The crown of stars on her head and the cosmic sky above suggest she is also connected to the mystical realm and the cycles of nature. She holds her pregnant stomach, which signifies her fertility, abundance, and growth. The Empress is a sign that you are full of creativity and have the tools and wisdom to give birth to your creations. Connecting with your feminine self and treating yourself to pleasures will make you feel good. Also, take a moment to feel grateful for the abundance that surrounds you: the beauty of nature and the goodness in your life. Practicing gratitude and spending time in nature will allow you to connect to your spiritual self more deeply, and ensure that the flow of abundance keeps coming.



IV. THE EMPEROR

Power, Control, Stability

The Emperor sits stoically upon his stone throne, holding an ankh (the symbol of life) and an orb (a symbol of dominion). He exudes power, reigning with strong will and intellect. The mountains behind him are suggestive of a solid foundation and unwavering stability. His beard symbolizes his wisdom and his paternal nature, while he maintains a sense of control. This card suggests that your life is at a stable and secure place. You can use your judgment and knowledge to make good decisions. You feel in control of your life because of the hard work and discipline that you have practiced. Maintain your boundaries as others may try to test you. The Emperor also reminds you of your leadership qualities and how you are able to inspire and motivate others.

V. THE HIEROPHANT

Rationality, Convention, Tradition

The Hierophant stands between two pillars, symbolizing law and liberty. Her hand gesture as well as the cross she holds in her other hand represent her religious stature. The crossed keys at her feet indicate the unlocking of great mysteries. This card encourages



you to be cautious and take action only after deep thought, rational debate, and a thorough weighing of possible outcomes. Embrace convention, tradition, rituals, and safety. Now is not the time to take risks or try new things. For now, it is better to stick to the path well-traveled and follow what has worked for others before you. This may also be a good time to seek out a mentor or teacher and learn something traditional and well-researched.

VI. THE LOVERS

Duality, Stability, Balance

The Lovers are shown as a couple in an intimate embrace. One belongs to the Earth while the other is full of stars, symbolizing the cosmos and spiritual realm. They represent a marriage of duality. The sun above them connotes passion and burning desire, and the lush nature that surrounds them suggests their love is healthy and nourishing. Despite being depicted as a man and woman, the Lovers are not about gender but the meeting of opposites, whether that be in your relationship with a romantic partner or within yourself. You must love and embrace both the light and dark in yourself and others. The Lovers remind you that successful romantic relationships can only be conducted when



you have a true love for yourself first. Remember that life is about stability and equilibrium—give what you want to receive.

VII. THE CHARIOT

Drive, Focus, Action

A woman stands in a decorated chariot pulled at great speed by two powerful horses. One horse is white and the other black, representing duality and opposing forces. They run in the direction of the river that flows beneath them, showing the need to surrender to the rhythm of life. This is a card of action, moving forward with drive and discipline. The appearance of the Chariot calls for commitment and self-motivation. Now is the time to put your ideas into play, to work toward your goals with focus and persistence. You should not be tempted by the easy route, but rather be willing to put in the extra work required to achieve your goals, if necessary. There may be obstacles to overcome, so you should be prepared to use your willpower to continue when the tough gets going. Know who you are, fundamentally, and follow your heart with determination and conviction.



VIII. STRENGTH

Confidence, Persistence, Patience

A woman stands in the jungle next to a mighty lion. The wild animal is subdued by her calm and compassionate energy. Above her head is the lemniscate, symbolizing her infinite wisdom and strength. This card asks you to show resilience and determination in times of distress and instability. It reminds you that you have an abundance of peace and power within yourself (physically as well as mentally) and that these attributes can be used to carry you forward. Often, patience and persistence are the best ways to approach uncertain and difficult situations, and these traits will serve you well. Avoid brute force, anger, and coercion to deal with the situation. You can better handle things by being patient and exuding calm, feminine energy.

IX. THE HERMIT

Solitude, Introspection, Inner Truth

A woman stands fearlessly alone on a hill, having taken her own route leading to introspection and self-mastery. She holds a lantern which illuminates the immediate path ahead of her, symbolizing the subconscious being uncovered, the revealing of what was once hidden. The Hermit is a role model for reflec-



tion, self-growth, and retreat. Taking some time alone will help you tune in to your inner truth and realign with your authentic path. Pilgrimage, solo travel, or simply spending some time by yourself are all encouraged activities. By doing so, you will clear your cluttered mind and hear your inner guide more clearly. Take one step at a time, and remember that the ultimate destination is always yourself.

X. THE WHEEL OF FORTUNE

Change, Cycles, Adaptability

The Wheel of Fortune is turned by the cycles of nature. Inside the Wheel is the word TORA, meaning “law,” and the symbols of the four alchemical elements: mercury, sulfur, water, and salt. The moon phases symbolize the constant changing and transformation of life. The way in which the Wheel works is not within our control. There is both comfort and warning in the fact that the Wheel will always be turning. It reminds you that everything is temporary, both the good and the bad. Being too attached to any specific outcome can cause pain, so be flexible and adaptable, as life is unpredictable. Release your grasp on things that are out of your control and have faith in the universe.



Keep your mind and heart open to synchronicities and miracles, and remain steady despite knowing that there is so much that is not within your power.

XI. JUSTICE

Law, Balance, Fairness

Lady Justice stands in the woodland, holding the carefully balanced scales of justice. In her other hand is a double-edged sword, symbolizing impartiality, and the ability to see both ways. She portrays fairness, balance, and the law. On her head she wears a crown with a square representing well-ordered thoughts. She judges with empathy and understanding, logic and compassion. Justice is a card that asks you to accept accountability for your actions and reminds you that you will be rewarded or punished accordingly. Conscious choice and ethical decision-making are important: consider things thoroughly using both your head and your heart to come to rational and fair decisions. Be aware of the impact your choices have on others around you, as well as yourself in the long run. Sometimes what you want to do may not be the right thing to do. Be honest with yourself and act with integrity. Justice will be served.



XII. THE HANGED ONE

Perspective, Pause, Insight

A woman hangs upside down, dangling from a tree over the river below. There is a sense of childlike playfulness about her as she views the world from her new perspective. Clearly, she is here by choice. She has suspended herself to gain a new angle on the world and herself. This card represents a change in perspective, a new way to view reality. It calls you to release old thought and behavior patterns that no longer serve you. The Hanged One can also indicate total surrender or self-sacrifice. It suggests that you may need to take a break from something and step back, giving yourself a chance to reevaluate. You are encouraged to take time away from your projects and routine, as this voluntary pause can help you gain greater insight into your path.

XIII. DEATH

Endings, Rebirth, Transformation

A woman lies in the ground, as if decaying. A tree grows where she lays and mushrooms sprout from her, symbolizing the endless cycle of life and death. Her demise is allowing new things to grow. The setting sun symbolizes the ending of the day, but it also encom-



passes the knowledge that a new one will come. This card is about new beginnings as much as it is about endings. It is about closing one door so that a new one may open to a more wholesome and aligned experience of life. Death represents transformation and rebirth. It asks you to let go in order to be cleansed of old thoughts, relationships, behaviors, and patterns that no longer serve you. In doing so, you will make space to invite in the new. Although the changes you are experiencing may be sudden and unwelcome, remember that destruction is sometimes necessary in order to progress.

XIV. TEMPERANCE

Moderation, Consideration, Balance

A winged angel stands with one foot in the water while the other remains on the dry earth, showing her connection to both the material and subconscious realms. She pours water between two cups, showing her fluidity and ability to move in harmony like the water. The path through the mountains behind her symbolizes a spiritual journey. Temperance calls for you to be stable and secure, yet still open to compromise and change. This card is about balance, being connected to your spiritual and emotional side as well as your mate-



rial and rational side. It is asking you to consider both routes and take the middle path. Be patient and peaceful, taking into account different factors in equal measure when making decisions. Take a long view of your goals, practicing moderation and balance.

XV. THE DEVIL

Darkness, Gratification, Shortsightedness

A horned Devil wears a sheer dress, holding a lit torch in one hand. Chained to her wrists are two enslaved women, naked and animalistic. The forest behind is gloomy and ominous, depicting a scene of darkness and evil. The Devil is about confronting the darker side of your personality. You may be acting out selfish wants and desires without considering the lasting effects, favoring instant gratification over long-term fulfillment. Think about how you can change your behavior in order to respect yourself more in the future. This is also a good time to contemplate the traits you have that can get you into trouble or make you act in ways that have a negative impact. Think about the roots and causes of these traits, bringing them to the surface so you can work on them for the future.



XVI. THE TOWER

Destruction, Chaos, Change

A woman falls from a tower that has been struck by a lightning bolt. She flees terror and destruction as flames shoot from the windows. The lightning bolt symbolizes a sudden insight which may be the catalyst for this startling change. This scene represents an unexpected and unwelcome event which has an immense impact. It may feel as though your world is crashing down around you and there is no escape. The Tower card foretells momentous changes, revolution, and transformation. Allow old structures to collapse so you can rebuild from the ground up. Trust that the universe will not give you anything you can't handle, and use this moment to become stronger, wiser, and more resilient.

XVII. THE STAR

Blessings, Encouragement, Hope

A woman stands on the edge of a stream, with one foot in the water, representing her intuition, and the other on dry land, representing her common sense and rational mind. She pours water from two pots, nourishing the earth and fertilizing the soil. The bird and tree symbolize nature and the Tree of Life, while the seven stars in the sky stand



for the seven chakras. She is a beacon of illumination and inspiration, offering hope and encouragement. You have the ability to tune into your feminine power and spiritual strength, as well as drawing from your practicality and grounded nature. You may have endured hardships, and the Star is here to signify a more peaceful time, offering blessings and hope for your bright future. Anything is possible, and your dreams can come true.

XVIII. THE MOON

Intuition, Illumination, Phases

The full moon in the sky illuminates a path winding into the distance. The eye symbolizes the Moon's great intuition. Two women are dancing, rejoicing, and celebrating in the moonlight. The crustacean emerging from the water at their feet is a symbol of enlightenment and the progression of consciousness. This card suggests that hidden things will be revealed, offering clarity and a chance for deeper introspection. Rely on your intuition and let it guide you in your decision-making, rather than giving too much importance to your rational thinking mind. Feel and listen to your inner voice and dreams. The Moon asks you to connect with the Divine Feminine and lean into the wisdom of the night.



XIX. THE SUN

Optimism, Positivity, Abundance

A woman basks in the sunshine. Four sunflowers grow behind her, representing the four kingdoms of nature: animal, vegetable, mineral, and human. The bright sun is a source of life on Earth, offering abundance and vitality. This card is a sign that you are being blessed with joy and happiness. It brings you strength and reminds you that your positivity and optimism will carry you through. You may feel a surge in energy and a drive to go out and achieve things. Right now, you are radiant and abundant, and people around you can feel the warm energy emanating from you. Bask in these blessings and share your joy with others.

XX. JUDGEMENT

Renewal, Introspection, Awakening

A woman stands under a shower, cleansing herself with her arms raised, looking out into the night sky. She is bare and vulnerable, exposed to the universe in her purest form. The Judgement card is about reflecting and evaluating. It asks you to take a deep, honest look inward. The universe is offering you the chance to level up, but you must weigh your options objectively. Tune in to who you



are at the core, and choose to be your most authentic self. You may feel vulnerable, but this is an essential part of becoming who you truly are. Cleanse yourself of your previous mistakes and poor decisions. Trust your own judgment.

XXI. THE WORLD

Completion, Fulfillment, Wholeness

A woman sits crossed-legged with the Earth in her lap. From it flows a stream, while the moon and stars sparkle in the sky, depicting the entire universe. Flowers and mountains are also present, symbolizing how bountiful and diverse it is here. The appearance of the World suggests that everything has come full circle and you have achieved what you set out to do. You may feel satisfied and deserving of your success after the journey you've been on to get here. Take a moment to reflect on the hardships and joys along the way. Count your blessings and feel gratitude toward those who have helped you. Revel in the wholeness you feel.



WANDS

ACE OF WANDS

New Beginnings, Growth, Ideas

A hand holding a wand floats in the clouds. Flowers grow up the wand, symbolizing a bounty of creative growth, and the gleaming crystal at the top represents good things to come. The clear and dreamy background suggests that you have a blank canvas for your creativity. The Ace of Wands offers you a new beginning, an opportunity for a new artistic endeavor or a fresh look at an old opinion. The chance is yours. It's never too late to start anew. This card asks you to believe in yourself, and act on your ideas and inspirations.

TWO OF WANDS

Decisions, Options, Change

Standing poised upon a balcony, a woman looks toward the sky. The glowing orb she holds symbolizes a bright future obtained by following her deepest intuition. Two wands suggest the presence of two options, and a decision needs to be made. While the mountains in the background look alluring, the woman remains on her balcony, in her com-



fort zone. The Two of Wands supports decisive action, travel, change, and new ideas. Being presented with choices can feel overwhelming, but your heart knows the way. Have confidence in yourself and make that first step—it is often the hardest. Trust yourself and know that you can succeed.

THREE OF WANDS

Momentum, Expansion, Progression

A woman stands on a flowery hill overlooking a beautiful coastline and beach. Her high vantage point allows her to see what is coming and the potential challenges and successes that she may encounter. The idyllic scenery suggests that good things are on the horizon, and moving forward will be rewarded. The Three of Wands offers encouragement to explore new paths. Whether it be a new job, a relationship, travel, or creative endeavor, you may be pleasantly surprised with what you find beyond the walls of your comfort zone. Be committed to your path and be prepared to overcome hurdles and difficulties that may appear along the way.



FOUR OF WANDS

Celebration, Achievement, Homecoming

A vibrant, lively scene as bright as a summer's day. Two women are frolicking amid sunny delights. Butterflies and flowers symbolize the happiness that comes from achievement and success. The castle behind them is a sign of harmony in both home and community. The Four of Wands is a card of enjoyment after having completed a goal or milestone. Now is a time for you to rest and celebrate after a period of work or struggle. Allow yourself to be happy and give yourself a well-deserved break. Rejoice in what you have accomplished. This card may also suggest you are returning home and reuniting with friends and family. You feel safe.

FIVE OF WANDS

Competition, Rivalry, Diversity

The Five of Wands shows a group of five women in a circle, pointing wands toward each other in a show of competition and rivalry. Each of the women has the same desire for success and growth, yet they come from different places and cannot see their common goals. This card connotes conflict with others in a struggle to achieve your goal. However, competition doesn't have to be a threat



to you. You can choose to view your competitors as a chance to better yourself. Working together, you can learn from your differences, inspire each other, and share your ideas and resources.

SIX OF WANDS

Success, Validation, Support

A woman returns home from her difficult conquest. She raises her wand to the air in an act of self-celebration, signifying her success. The five women below congratulate her, rewarding her with validation. The Six of Wands is about celebrating your achievements. You have reached an important milestone or a goal, and you should feel proud of yourself. Don't be afraid to share your stories of success with others, as it can be beneficial to feel their support and recognition—your loved ones love to see you winning. You still have some way to go, but you can continue with newfound confidence and faith that your people are supporting you.

SEVEN OF WANDS

Strength, Defiance, Protection

The Seven of Wands shows a woman defending herself as six wands are wielded toward her. Despite being outnumbered, she stands



her ground and attempts to overcome greater forces. She raises her wand high in the air, telling us she has divine support from above, as well as her intuition. The message from the Seven of Wands is one of defense and defiance. Although you may be facing conflict, have confidence in your own decisions, standing strong when you are questioned or challenged. You have worked hard to get to where you are, so have your own back and stand firm in your conviction.

EIGHT OF WANDS

Swiftness, Energy, Change

Eight wands move through the air with swiftness and ease. They represent change and movement, progressing forward with velocity. Magical powers are at work here. The wands flying through the air signify that change can be rapid, and moving forward is key to progress on your journey. See the Eight of Wands as a chance to take the next leap of faith, making the most of this flow of dynamic energy. Be clear about your goals so you can move in the direction that will serve you best. The appearance of this card encourages you to take immediate action to take advantage of the surging powers at your disposal.



NINE OF WANDS

Resilience, Persistence, Challenges

The Nine of Wands shows a woman standing in front of gathered wands. The wands symbolize previously completed work or challenges overcome. This card reminds you that you have come so far, and although you may be facing another setback, you should not give up. You have shown resilience, you have already jumped over many hurdles, and this experience offers encouragement to keep going.
