






## The Hermit: Green Tea






## **The Sun: English Breakfast**




## **The World: International Buffet**






## Five of Wands: Fondue


## King of Cups: Seafood Tom Yum






## **Two of Swords: Toast with Jams**




## Seven of Swords: Pizza
