The story brought you here... You've felt tickles of magic, like belly butterflies, as long as you've lived. You've created worlds with your spirit guides, conversed with animals, and traded energy with herbs. You traverse the shadows of wild woods where others fear to tread. You vision with your mind's eye and believe in your beating heart's desires strongly enough to make those dreams come true. Most importantly, you've always listened to the special voice inside of you that only you can hear. This is why you stand before me now. It is why you have been granted access.



Welcome to the Tarot of the Witch's Garden. Allow me to introduce myself. I am the Magician (Sorceress or Witch, if you prefer) of the garden. You'll spy a painting of me on card number one. I've worked with the spirits, animals, and botanicals to bring this once-abandoned land back to life. This magical landscape has been crafted for magical beings just like us.

The witch's garden contains archetypal animal, vegetable, and mineral energy. Fantastical blossoms, nightshades, and wildlife populate the cards. Darting insects, mythological creatures, and infinite worlds of manifestation overflow. Everything inside this tarot is alive, electric, and available to stoke the vitality thriving inside of you.

Allow this tarot to become a field of experimental possibility. Here you can test out options and ideas before unraveling them into waking life. Some cards appear like a dream. Other cards flutter and fly with a mind and consciousness of their own. Be patent with the cards. Be patient with yourself. Sometimes it will feel like pulling information from a stone. Other times you'll be an open channel. A tarot practice is just that: a practice. Return to the deck repeatedly to develop your skills. Gardens are cyclical living things, just like us. Not everything found inside the witch's garden is perfect or friendly. Gardens are a reflection of the world and contain all possibilities, lessons, and challenges, even the ugly bits we'd prefer to avoid but must ultimately face. One thing can always be counted upon: the garden and tarot always bring us back to ourselves.

As the reader you are both a witch and an explorer of the garden. A true sorceress is not out there manipulating others. She works magic on herself. A witch dives into mystery at every turn. The garden is yours to enjoy as well as tend. You will find yourself taking on the



role of every card because tarot is a reflection of you. Pull your focus. Sometimes you are inside the card. Other times you are the gentle hand guiding energies, animals, and people toward their heart's desire.

Magic is real. Its sharp energy is as brilliant as sunshine and as mysterious as July's buck moon. This pulsing electricity infuses everything you do. It pumps through your veins to fill you with beauty, love, and ecstasy. Magic is such an acutely normal state of existence that it often goes unnoticed to those without eyes to see. Even the most enchanted among us sometimes disregard the efficacy of our power. Magic happens when the authentic essence of who you are comes into alignment with the expanding energy of the universe.

Tarot is a magical gateway. Its archetypes and symbols act as an organizing principle for the thoughts parading in the three-ring circus of the mind. Tarot offers an opportunity to step back, observe options, and make a conscious choice, thereby altering your destiny.

Cultivating enchantment in life is as pleasurable as picking wild-flowers. The rules of magic and gardening are the same because they spring from the same source. Just as posy, cucumber, and pumpkin seeds are made to grow and flourish, so are the seeds deposited in the soul of your soul. Flowerbeds require sunlight, water, and space to grow. Magical seeds inside of you are cultivated with the light of intention, quenched with the thrust of emotion, and grown inside the sacred space of gratitude and compassion.

Listen to silence. Create empty space. It holds all potential. If you observe carefully, the expansiveness inside and around you will tell you what it wants to become. Limits encourage the energy of manifestation. Create boundaries around your magic the way you would a flower bed of snapdragons. Plant seeds in accordance to nature's



cycles. Use attention as a tending tool but don't interfere or rush the way magic unfolds. Trust. Everything happens in accordance to its own time.


Each one of us is the center point of a magical universe. To locate magical sparks, focus on what you are longing for. Talent, passion, and interests will point us in the right direction. Tarot is the perfect tool to access these treasures. Listen when the cards sing to you, and brace yourself when they shine the spotlight on what you'd rather avoid. Be brave with your cards. Search for information and clarity you don't already possess. We come to tarot to discover what we don't know. Don't ever be afraid to get the cards wrong. Everything required for a rich tarot practice is tucked away inside you. You need only unearth it.

How to Use These Secrets

This book is set up in four parts. If you are new to tarot, read this book all the way though. It offers all the information you'll need to work with the cards. If you have an established tarot practice, these secrets may offer fresh ideas to enliven your tarot routines.

Part 1 is tending the soil and preparing a personal tarot practice. It contains simple instructions and cartomancy basics. Part 2 is planting potent magical seeds into your subconscious that will empower tarot-reading skills. Part 3 is the cultivation of depth and meaning in a detailed card-by-card explanation of the deck. You will find the title of the card, a single keyword, and its Golden Dawn correspondence, plus a witching rhyme for spells and depth of archetype. You will find meanings and keywords for upright and reversed cards. Reversed cards are often met with dismay by readers and querents alike. A magical elixir has been included to mend the wound of reversals. The reversal can be righted by asking a suggested question. Flip a new card to









E arth is the garden's foundation, and a thriving garden requires healthy soil. A tarot practice also requires healthy bedrock. Here you will find card basics. Earth is where the body, self, and soul should be grounded every time you take up work with the cards. Take a moment to clear the mind and focus on the breath. Imagine the bottom of the feet rooting into the ground beneath you. This rooted connection will keep you tethered when you are off and flying with the cards. The imaginative landscape beneath will grow and expand with each tarot experience.



Card Handling and Care

Tarot is a sacred tool and a trusted companion. The cards are seventyeight aspects of the self. They shimmer like facets of a gem. The deeper you care for your cards, the more direct and effective their guidance becomes. Tarot of the Witch's Garden is a wellspring of power. Harness it for personal and spiritual growth.

A magical tarot practice holds the same rules and requirements as all other personal relationships. Getting to know tarot is like starting a new friendship. Carve out time for the self and the deck. Clear the mind and focus on what the cards are expressing. Pass them through your hands. Examine each image one at a time. Become acquainted by observing the images without asking any questions.

sacred RITUAL: To create a bonding experience, light a cone, bundle of dried herbs, or stick of incense. Smoke is ruled by the element of air. It opens our awareness to the celestial realm while forging connections with the spiritual and archetypal world. Pass each card through the smoke. Use a soft gaze to absorb the cards' images, colors, and energy.

Bring your cards to bed with you. Forge a subconscious connection by tucking the cards beneath your pillow. Set them on your night-stand. Pull a single card and journal about it. Gaze at your cards before drifting off to sleep and invite a specific card into your night dreams.

Tarot of the Witch's Garden aligns with nature's energy. Charge your deck with intuitive and psychic power by placing near a window under the vapors of the full moon. Infuse it with potential and new beginnings by doing the same during a new moon. Charge the deck



with expansion and joy by placing it by a window for a solar infusion on a sunny day.

HOW WILL YOU STORE THE CARDS? They can be left out or carefully secreted away. By leaving the deck out on a table, stand, or altar, you can observe them continually. They will be at hand for quick questions or consultations.

Often tarot readers like to protect their deck from roaming energies, people, and influences. To seal the deck away, wrap it in a silk cloth to preserve it when not in use. Tuck the deck inside a soft velvety bag, carved wooden box, or secret storage book. Crystals, herbs, and talismans may be tucked inside the tarot bag or box.

Decide in advance who will touch the deck. Some readers protect their deck's vibe by being the only one to touch the seventy-eight cards. Other readers like clients to shuffle during readings to imbue the cards with the question at hand. Readers often keep one special deck exclusively for private use and an additional deck for public readings. There is no right or wrong way, only personal preference. You can always change your mind.

Tarot Grimoire

A grimoire is a witch's book of spells. It is a personal repository of magical experience. Tarot is a book of magic whose pages change with every shuffle. Keeping a tarot grimoire is highly recommended. Writing the information received from the cards allows the reader to process it. Specific messages and insight will be recorded. Use it to mark intuitive and psychic hits. Keep track of synchronicity and magical results. Record observations and effective tarot spreads.



A tarot grimoire can be sweet and simple, with quick reference notes, or highly detailed. Ornate grimoires contain records of all magical experiences. Keep a page for every card, a section of tarot spreads and spells, sketches of the cards, notes, poetry, and questions. Describe events unfolding inside tarot meditations. Carve daily space to record inspiration and ideas.

Tarot Reading Essentials

The art of tarot reading is a mixture of observation, intuition, and storytelling. No two readings are ever the same. No two people read tarot the same way. A reading style is always specific to the reader and the reader's unique sensitivities. Go slowly. Take time.

Readings are an opportunity to foster intuitive flow and exercise psychic muscles. Psychic hits can be defined as information coming from outside the body. A psychic flash often feels like information delivered like a soft soap bubble popping in the head. Do not be surprised if you experience a psychic flash that is confirmed after your reading. Conversely, don't be discouraged if it doesn't happen right away. Psychic information from the outside world carries its own intelligence. It is usually beyond our control.

Intuition is a gentle knowing, a constant river moving through the body. Intuition appears as a quick and ready insight when reading the cards. Intuitive information comes from within. Tarot archetype, symbol, and color move past linguistic limits to speak directly to the intuitive self.

You are the reader when reading tarot for yourself or another person. If you read tarot for another person, they are called the querent, client, or sitter. Tarot cards are always read facing the reader's point of view.



Thoughtful questions are essential during a reading. Helpful questions are a direct course to the highest, most creative solutions. Questions blow open the door of possibility. Clever questions help the brain, heart, and gut operate with clarity.

Excellent questions acknowledge the role a person plays in their future and states the desired outcome. Questions beginning with "how" or "what" acknowledge personal power. How can I attract a healthy romantic relationship? What can I do to increase my finances? How can I come into alignment with my highest self?

To read the cards, either formulate a question and draw a single card to answer it or choose a tarot spread. Tarot spreads are designed with specific card positions to answer multiple aspects of a question. For example, if the popular three-card past, present, and future spread is chosen, the reader would formulate a question. How can I find peace in my relationship with X? The three cards of a three-card spread shine light on the past, what is currently in the present, and the most likely future unless an adjustment is made.

Shuffle the deck before pulling the cards. The shuffling technique doesn't matter as long as the cards are mixed. Mix the cards facedown on the table or shuffle like a casino card dealer.

TAROT TIP: Take special note of any card that leaps from the deck or falls on the floor while mixing and shuffling. These "jumper" cards can be saved and interpreted at the end of a reading. A jumper card is an unexpected yet urgent message from the tarot to the reader.

Place the cards in a stack facedown once the shuffling is complete. Flip the desired number of cards over from left to right, as if opening the pages of a book, and place them into the required spread position.



It is important to pull cards from left to right to ingrain it into the hand's muscle memory. Once this becomes habit, it will always be apparent if the drawn card is upright or reversed.

Reversed cards appear upside down to the reader in a tarot spread. Ignore reversed cards until ready to incorporate their meanings. Turn a reversed card right-side up. Continue with the spread. It is acceptable to leave reversed cards as they appear and interpret as the intuition guides. Once the reader is ready to integrate reversals, they can be read in numerous ways. A reversal can reflect the opposite of the card's normal meaning, energetic blockages, the cards requiring extra attention and focus, and shadow issues you instinctively shy away from but shouldn't. It doesn't matter how reversals are read, but it is important to determine how you will choose to deal with them before laying out the cards.

Read Tarot Immediately

Fear of being "wrong" is the biggest impediment of all potential readers. Don't be afraid to get it wrong. Nothing throws up insurmountable barriers like fear. Is tarot steeped in hundreds of years of esoteric theory and rich, highly structured meaning? Yes. Is this something to study that will add depth and richness to readings? Absolutely. Is all that information required now? Nope. Take it slow.

Trust what is in front of you. No one sees, feels, and experiences the world like you do. Tarot's power lies in the abstract nature of symbol. Symbols are subjective. Every human carries a unique symbolic dictionary within them. Basic symbols, images like sun, moon, or skull, hold universal and cultural meaning. Larger concepts like lovers, mother, and father are archetypal and thereby embedded cross-culturally, yet how a symbol is interpreted is unique to each reader. If a card's symbol strikes a chord in you, it holds meaning. It is your golden ticket. This is your message.



TENDING THE SOIL

A message appears once an item or story in the card catches your attention. It can feel like an attractive stranger catching your eye across a crowded room. Something comes alive inside the body. Use that spark by figuring out what the message means in the context of the question at hand. Examine the symbol. If a character's gesture catches your attention, consider what it means to you. If you were a figure inside the card, which one would you be? Make up a story about a card as if you were reading a picture book to a child. What is the message of the card?

Daily Practice

A card-a-day-practice is profound yet simple. It requires a few minutes each day. Craft a question and select a card. Spend a few moments contemplating the meaning and message. Make a single card pull part of your daily routine. The gift of daily practice occurs when the clear and precise guidance gleaned from the cards overflows into daily decision making.

Clear the mind. Formulate a question. Close the eyes. Take three deep inhales and exhales. Shuffle the deck. Ask: "What do I need to know?" Flip the top card over and greet the image. Let the story, observation, or impression of the card wash over you. Write down the intuitive message received.

Return to the daily card later in the evening or before bed. How did the card relate to the events of the day? Was there a synchronistic experience? Was there a spot-on insight? Did the card take on a new meaning in the context of the day's experience? Did you feel you embodied the energy of the card at any point? Did you meet someone who matched the card's energetic nature? Did a situation unfold that applies to the card's basic meaning? Note your observations and ideas in your tarot grimoire.



Part 2 Planting Seeds

nce a garden bed is prepared and the soil is prepped, it is time to plant the seeds. Seeds have tiny roots secreted away inside. Once the roots take hold, the plant uses ingrained intelligence to grow into whatever it is destined to become. The same is true for personal magic and a tarot practice.

This section offers jumping-off points to understanding what the cards mean and how they fit together inside tarot's structure. Use and integrate the information in your own way. No two people interpret tarot or read it in exactly the same manner. The deeper you gaze into the cards, the more you will see. Learn as many different techniques and systems as possible.



Deconstruct the deck by pulling out the cards referenced in the following sections. Lay the cards out in order. Examine them in detail to learn how they relate to each other as a whole system.

The Major Arcana

Tarot's seventy-eight cards are broken down into the major and minor arcana. The word arcana stems from the root word arcane, meaning "secret." The entire deck is broken into major secrets and minor secrets. The major arcana is numbered zero through twenty-one, the Fool through the World. Major arcana cards reflect influential and major life moments.

The major arcana reflects the story of the witch's journey. The witch's journey is the initiation of learning and experience leading to soul growth and evolution. The witch discovers what she is made of and how she interacts with the emotional, intellectual, physical, and spiritual qualities of being alive. It is a cyclical journey ending and beginning many times during a witch's lifetime. A witch's journey is as constant as the seasons of the year and as rhythmic as the lunar cycles caressing the earth. May you journey well.

The Witch's Earthly Journey

FOOL-CHARIOT

The Fool is numbered zero because she contains all things. Cards one through seven reflect the earthly journey and formation of personality. The Fool is the active intelligence and animating principle of the witch. She sets off in search of adventure and experience. The Fool encounters a series of personalities, each more intriguing than the last, and learns from each of them: a charismatic Magician, a mys-



terious High Priestess, an expressive Empress, an imposing Emperor, and a teacherly Hierophant. The Fool explores the ecstatic, passionate Lovers card and sets off in the Chariot. The earthly journey culminates and the spiritual journey begins.

The Witch's Spiritual Journey

STRENGTH-TEMPERANCE

The Fool discovers the inner world of spirit and soul that extends beyond the physical body and provokes the active imagination. Power is received in Strength; the Hermit examines the nature of the soul. The Wheel embraces the mystical mechanics of reality. Justice unravels the higher purposes. The Fool contemplates and integrates all lessons in the Hanged Man, only to lose everything in Death. At Temperance the Fool begins again on a higher level of understanding.

The Witch's Celestial Journey

DEVIL-WORLD

Having overcome and faced profound fear and internal repression in the Devil, in the Tower the Fool releases all attachments and control over the uncontrollable. Newly freed, the Fool ascends to the heavens as reflected in the Star, Moon, and Sun cards. Judgement calls out with one final test. The Fool rises to the occasion and enters a state of transcendence, the greatest possible reward, in the World card.

The Minor Arcana

The minor arcana reflects day-to-day life moments. While the major arcana tends to be soul shaking, the minors are the ins and outs of regular life. It is composed of the four suits and aligning court cards.



Swords: Air

ACE-10, PAGE, KNIGHT, QUEEN, AND KING OF SWORDS

Swords reflect thoughts, ideas, and stories. They are the inner and outer voice. Swords reflect how a person perceives their role in the world and how they think. Swords are decisions, how one speaks to others, how the words and opinions of others affect the individual. Swords reflect the quality of the mind.

Swords align with the element of air. Air moves as fast as the mind. It is the quality of wind during a storm of thoughts. It is the buoyancy of oxygen filling the lungs and the pace of the breath, depending on how one perceives what is happening to them. A sword slices through the air quickly. Swords, like words, can wound or protect. Swords are often the scariest suit of the deck because they are where personal judgments are made. Swords reflect the witch's inner voice.

Cups: Water

ACE-10, PAGE, KNIGHT, QUEEN, AND KING OF CUPS

Cups reflect feelings, imagination, and dreams. They are the appreciation of art, love, and beauty. Cups contain the entire emotional spectrum, from raging anger to all-encompassing love. Cups are emotive highs and lows and feelings of utter darkness and blinding light. Cups are the pool of compassion from which empathy and love spring.

Cups align with the emotional ever-changing nature of water, from the quiet pond of contentment to raging seas of heartbreak. The element of water is river-like feelings, clouds of imagination, and misty fantasies. Cups contain pelting ice of shame, falling snow of wonder, and gentle rain of delight. Cups are a container to be filled with any emotion.



Wands: Fire

ACE-10, PAGE, KNIGHT, QUEEN, AND KING OF WANDS

Wands are energy, passion, and virility. They reflect desire, romance, and career. Wands are intentions, belief, and divinity. Wands are the heat of intensity, the internal fire of objectives, and spiritual devotion.

Wands align with the element of fire and emulate the sun itself. All things germinate and grow with the application of solar energy. Crackling, consuming flames sustain life by warming the body and cooking food. Wands are the burning ember of desire and the hot coals of passion. The symbol aligns with the spellcaster's magic wand.

Pentacles: Earth

ACE-10, PAGE, KNIGHT, QUEEN, AND KING OF PENTACLES

Pentacles reflect everything seen, smelled, felt, tasted, and touchable in the physical world. Pentacles are friends, family, and pets as well as the house and home, personal finance, and resources. Pentacles are the food we prepare and consume each evening—the flesh, blood, and bones of the body. Pentacles are everything that can be measured and counted.

Pentacles align with the element of earth. They represent the security of loamy, fecund dirt and the compostable quality of regeneration. Pentacles are tectonic plates of change and the manipulation of material projects. A pentacle is circular like the molecules composing all earthly matter.

Court Cards

ALL PAGES, KNIGHTS, QUEENS, AND KINGS

Court cards represent aspects of the self, psyche, and personality. They are the different roles cycled through in any given day. Court



cards represent people. They are the self, friends, family, and coworkers. Court cards are the people you partner with, the children you care for, strangers passed on the street. They are characters in movies, plays, and novels. Court cards offer strategies and attitudes for any task at hand.

Court cards are often gendered. It is helpful to think of court cards in terms of energy. Everyone contains masculine and feminine, youthful and mature energy that can be balanced or emphasized as needed throughout the day, according to preference and circumstance.

- · Pages carry childlike energy.
- Knight carry teen energy.
- · Queens carry mature female energy.
- · Kings carry mature masculine energy.

Tarot and Astrology

Farmers through the ages used celestial energy for effective planting and harvesting. Fruit-bearing crops (like corn and tomatoes) thrive when planted during the waxing moon, while flowering bulbs and root vegetables (carrots and beets) are best planted under the waning moon. The gravitational pull of the moon affects root development. Western magical practitioners have long assigned astrological correspondences to each vegetable, fruit, herb, and flower in existence. The tarot also has its own uniquely assigned astrological associations.

Modern astrological tarot associations were assigned by a secret society of artists, intellectuals, and magicians called the Hermetic Order of the Golden Dawn. The Golden Dawn formed in London at the turn of the twentieth century. Their membership included author Bram Stoker, literary icon W. B. Yeats, and the creators of the Rider-



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Waite-Smith deck, occultist Arthur Edward Waite and visual artist Pamela Colman Smith. The group used tarot as the organizing principle of their magical practice.

The Golden Dawn tweaked tarot's structure (switching Strength and Justice's traditional placement) to fit the arcana into their astrological system with a near-perfect symmetry. The astrological associations in this book align with the Golden Dawn's assignments. You'll find the astrological association of each card tucked beneath the card's keyword.

Tarot and Numerology

Numbers and patterns come in handy when interpreting card meanings. Just as a peach pit sequentially moves through stages of growth and becomes a tree, so do the numbers in tarot express how a situation is developing. Numbers become a shortcut to reading and interpretation. The card's number will describe where the situation is and how it is developing. All the reader needs to do is examine the number and include the quality of the suit. For example, a spread containing many aces suggests multiple new ideas and options. Twos and threes suggest the beginning stages of a cycle. Conversely, a spread containing multiple tens suggests the situation is ending. Eights and nines reflect culmination. Fives are the halfway point of a cycle and suggest the struggle or challenge to be overcome.

- 1's = new beginnings and fresh ideas; the seed.
- 2's = choices to be made before you proceed; the sprouting stalk.
- 3's = creativity and cooperation are required; leaves and tendrils.



- 4's = stability supports you; healthy roots are established.
- 5's = challenges and strife; drought, storms, blights.
- 6's = gifts and good feelings abound; the first bloom.
- 7's = uncanny luck and synchronicity everywhere; unexpected blossoming.
- 8's = ease, flow, and results appear; strong, healthy plants are ripe for propagation.
- 9's = you are getting what you want; savoring the harvest.
- 10's = situation reaches its conclusion; turning over for winter.

Clandestine Colors

Color can be interpreted like a symbol. Use color for energetic information. The key to interpreting color is personal experience. Does sky blue make you feel dreamy? Does grape purple shower you with regal feeling? Does yellow make you want to sing like a canary? Does your blood pump faster when you spy smoldering red? Does shimmering silver make you feel luxurious? Consider how you feel about colors and use it to interpret the message in the cards.

Reading Color Example

Here's an example of how to interpret color in a card. A girl named Jack asks Tarot of the Witch's Garden, "What can I focus on to have the best day ever?" She shuffles, flips, and receives the Three of Wands. The card's glowing pink and purple hues remind her of gentle intuitive pops. Her message is: "Listen to the inner self to stoke my magic today. The choices that count are the ones that spring from inside me." She examines the rest of the card. Wands reflect energy. She sees it is a good



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day to focus on moving forward. The figure sets a spell in motion. Jack interprets it as an opportunity to embark on something new.

Meditative Journeys

Book knowledge is useful; however, to truly get to know tarot, one must experience the cards. Soft gaze meditation is the key to unlocking aspects of the cards that otherwise go unnoticed. Just as meditating into an herb or flower will unlock its secrets to you, meditations into tarot cards unleash visceral worlds of wonder.

To meditate into a tarot card, carve out private time where you will not be disturbed. Clear the mind of all distraction. If annoying thoughts intrude, notice them and let them go. Take three deep inhales and exhales. Observe the chosen tarot card. Use a soft gaze to observe. See the quality and shape of the card's illustration. Move deeper by venturing into the card with your mind's eye. What do you see beyond the borders of the card? Does the landscape continue? What sounds catch your attention? Is a dog barking or leaves rustling? Do you catch the scent of a flower or wood smoke? What does the card feel like? Can you touch a refreshing pool of water or feel the tickle of fairy wings under your nose?

Culminate the meditation by requesting a message directly from the heart of the card. Write down the message in your grimoire. If the message or advice does not make sense at first, give it some time. Sit with it rather than rushing to pull another card or get a secondary message. Always end your meditation with a gesture of gratitude. Acknowledge the message with a gentle thank you. Always treat your cards with manners and respect. We ask a lot of tarot and must remember to give back to the energy of the cards as we would in any relationship.



Part 3



Cultivating Depth and Meaning

ow that the seeds of a tarot practice have been planted, it is time to dig in, dive deep, and explore each card. The following seventy-eight card descriptions include:

- a number to aid in numerological shortcuts
- a single keyword provided as a shortcut into the card's meaning
- an astrological association assigned by the Golden Dawn
- a charm, rhyme, and incantation for tarot spells



- an explanation: the cards contain infinite pools of wisdom and meaning; readers are encouraged to develop their own personal meanings and relationship with each card
- upright and reversed meanings: shortcuts to tarot's visual language and core interpretations
- "To right the reversal": reversals are often viewed as
 energetic blockages. If you are uncomfortable with the
 reversed meaning, a single question is provided at the end

Upright: Stand in self-knowledge. Access inner power.


Honor the sacred self. Intuition. Silence. Knowing who you are. Blueprint. Eternal. Authenticity. Mystery. Perfection.

His crown is fashioned from the wood of her tree. This is the Emperor.

The satyr's presence is a reminder of the magical nature of commitment. Invisible helpers and newfound energies are drawn like moths to a flame when one commits to take action.

The Chariot's crown is crafted from starlight. The center of his vehicle reveals the lunar magnetism of the moon's three phases. It

Her waist reveals a charm bag and herbal bundle reflecting her sequestered plant magic workings. A potted juniper tree is the elemental protector of all knowledge gained within. She raises the lantern of her wisdom as a quiet mischief of mice gather in front of her. This is the Hermit card.

The Hermit's secret is introspection. Teachers and guides offer inspiration, clues, and codification, yet the individual must journey inward for answers. Truth is cultivated when focus turns inward. Contemplative practice breeds wisdom.

The Hermit's cottage marks physical isolation. It is removal of the self from the influence, thoughts, and energies of others. The

glen of fractured sunlight pulls you closer to the sound of whirring water. A buzzing in the belly pulls you toward a pulsating energy source. You arrive to discover you are not the only one drawn to this magical spot. You stand before the Wheel of Fortune.

A pink lotus flower blossoms at the center of the wheel. Lotus flowers root into deep, murky mud. They rise to the surface and open their petals in sunlight each day. It echoes the human nature of moving from darkness to light. A mandala is the mapping of space. Four spokes mark the four directions with alchemical symbols of earth, air, fire, and water. Four more spokes divide the space and are engraved with the letters TARO. It arranges to make the words ROTA, which is Latin for "wheel," and TORA, a version of the Hebrew word meaning "law."

The animals around the wheel mark various stages of the cycles of life. All passages are included: from decades to years, from days



to minutes, from the cycles of the moon to the seasonal rhythms of nature. A wise all-seeing owl at the summit of the wheel marks clear vision, wisdom, and stability. A snake moves down the wheel as declining energy and return to earth. A fox moves up the wheel, marking ascent and rising of vitality.

Old order is overthrown.


Fear not, there is no need to mourn

Temperance is often interpreted literally as the word of moderation, restraint, and abstinence, yet the moment you lock eyes with her, you cultivate richer meaning. Temperance intermingles possibilities with her cups. She merges life and death energy. She mirrors yin and yang while inhabiting the space between silence and fluidity. She is movement between the spiritual self and the earthly self. Temperance appears to mark the honing of skills. To temper an object is to make it sharper. It is getting better at what you do.

Complexity is Temperance's secret. Opposing thoughts and ideas are equally held and blended together in unexpected ways. Synergy replaces repression, and a space of grace and dignity flowers into shimmering possibility. An evolutionary path unfolds.

You are led by a force greater than yourself to follow the sound. It leads you to an incendiary glow in the distance. You creep through the bushes to get as close to the vision as possible without giving yourself away. A terrifying female basks in furious delight. The Lovers are chained like dogs at her feet. They could easily remove the chains from their necks, but instead they glower at each other. Is this an outcome or a choice? Welcome to the archetype of the Devil.

The secret of the Devil card is ego. The angrier the Lovers are, the stronger the Devil grows. The Devil's sustenance includes shame, anger, repressed sexuality, jealousy, addiction, cruelty, hatred, and



personal justification. Low self-worth and blaming the other breed chaos and rob the individual of meaningful experience.

The Devil's chains of desire keep the individual from experiencing peace in the present moment. The Devil is distraction. Esoterically, the witch must transcend the devil to propagate her magic. The witch need not slay the demon. Ego and fear's basic function keeps the individual safe from harm. The witch's work is to understand how fear and ego operate in order to not be controlled by it.

The tumultuous sky sends a monster lightning bolt smack into the tree. Luckily, two badgers and a fairy have come to the rescue and saved them from a deadly fall.

The Tower reflects unexpected destruction and upheaval. It is loss, terror, and disruption. But the secret of the Tower is emancipation. Releasing expectation and attachment to desire is the natural outcome of integrating the arcana of the Devil. Once illusions of control are released, everything changes; anything that did not fit into life falls away. The Tower reflects the disruption of an old way of being. It is the clearing space—the end of the old cycle. What is no longer



useful is swept away. Life rearranges itself as soul healing extends to every nook, cranny, and corner of the witch's life.

Deep, evocative internal healing is often intertwined with the disruption in the external way a life is lived. Relationships fall away, old habits are broken, and real world changes are made. The soul evolves in alignment with the authentic High Priestess self. It is the last link in the Lovers' chain, which held together something that no longer works. Metamorphosis is uncomfortable; why else would the self fear the very thing it desires? If it were comfortable, you wouldn't have resisted it to begin with.

- CUP #1: A vibrant victory wreath rises from the cup, connecting it to the World card. The alchemical symbol of Saturn is engraved on the cup. A skull sits to the left as a reminder of the deceptive illusion of success.
- CUP #2: A female micro goddess of Eros in a Greek-style dress emerges from the cup. The sign of Venus is engraved on the cup, connecting her to the Empress card's sensuality and tactile creativity.
- CUP #3: A snake rises from the cup inscribed with the astrological glyph of Mercury. This connects to the Magician's traditional snake belt and fills the cup with the energy of conjure.
- CUP #4: A veiled figure rises from within. The waxing moon is engraved on the cup, connecting it to the High Priestess.

 This cup connects to all aspects of lunar power.
- CUP #5: A dragon rises from the cup. The alchemical symbol of the sun connects this cup to the Sun card and the growing power of solar energy.

A spell's enchantment begins the moment the witch decides to cast it. If you had the power to ask for anything in the world, what would it be? Articulating a magical goal is the first step of spellcasting. Write down what you desire. Get detailed. Your writing doesn't have to be poetic, artistic, or grammatically correct. No one will see it. Figure out exactly what is to be asked. Spellcasting is like baking. If vanilla coconut cake were desired, the baker wouldn't use a cherry rhubarb pie recipe.

Imagine what life looks like once the desire is granted. Open your imagination and enjoy the contemplation of what is possible. Energetic pleasure combined with intention makes for stellar results. Imagine the pleasure of icing buttercream frosting across the cake, serving it to friends, and tasting the first bite. When your spell comes true, how do you feel? What is different? Write it down. Once you have envisioned the outcome, craft the intention of your spell into a single sentence. A sentence containing the specific desire is important. Emotion and imagination are the emotive heart of spellcasting. It is a magnetic force pulling universal forces to conspire in your favor.

Next, select your magical accessories. These are items whose energy supports the intended desire. Choose an aligning tarot card for the spell's essence. For example, select the Empress for creativity spells, the Emperor for boundaries and protection, the Star to activate the muse, and so on. Peruse sensual accessories and align with the spell's goal; candles (red candles for passion spells), clothing (silk slips for sleep spells), flowers (snapdragons for friendship), herbs (witch hazel for psychic protection), and essential oils (lavender for intelligence). A spell is your creative call to the universe. The spell can be as detailed or simple as you like.



Unless you are working with a friend or group, spellcasting is private business. It should be done alone. Do not speak about your spellcraft unless you are seeking advice from another witch. The potency of a spell's power reverberates when kept between yourself and the universe. Like repeatedly opening the stove to check and letting the heat out before the cake is baked, chatting about your spells scatters the energy before it has had time to unfold.

Consider timing when planning a spell. It is helpful (but not necessary) to align the spell's timing with outside forces such as the astrological season, the waxing moon (whose energy helps attract), or the waning moon (whose energy helps release). Cast a spell at the stroke of midnight, twilight, or sunrise, as these are the moments it is easiest to walk between worlds. Witches lead busy lives; sometimes the most potent spell is cast when a moment of privacy is carved out for the self. Work with what you have. Magic is adaptable.

Cleanse the body and aura with a salt bath, shower, or outdoor bathing in a pool, pond, river, or ocean. Waters clear away unneeded energies and attitudes. Let the water drain any negativity and blocks. Bathing offers meditative space in preparation for spellcasting.

To cast the spell, have all ingredients on hand. Call to the four suits (elements) to aid you in your spell while moving in a clockwise circle. This opens sacred manifesting space. Lay the chosen tarot card(s). Visualize the intention. Read your written goal. Feel the spell unfolding. Perform other activities, meditations, or invocations. Raise energy and direct it toward the chosen goal.


To end the spell, close the sacred space as carefully as it was opened. Move counterclockwise and thank each of the suits (elements). Offer gratitude and offerings to any helpful energy that was called upon.




The most important thing to remember is to let go of all expectations once the spell is complete. A watched pot never boils. Let nature play its part. Magic manifests unexpectedly. Don't stand in the way by holding the weight of expectation. The honeycrisp apple you asked for may show up as a blood orange. You'll discover blood oranges are even tastier. Trust in your magic. Be patient. Let go. If your spell doesn't work, there was a good reason for it; imagine if everything you ever wanted came true! The universe always provides what is needed. Trust in it.































Fairy Godmother Spell Communicate this spell to your fairy godmother by blowing bubbles with a handmade wand.




Ace of Pentacles Garden Path Spell




Spell to Banish a Ghost To banish noisy spirits from the home or rid yourself of plaguing negativity.

Envision what is plaguing you. Fill in the following sentence:


